the world today series latin america offers the latest available economic demographic political and cultural information including solid statistical data expressing freedom violence and governmental orientation consideration is given to the evolving relationships with the united states and other latin american nations revisions have also addressed new historical interpretations for example of the history of mexico and latest political changes for example in venezuela and cuba maps charts and photographs provide extensive visual expressions of the region its geography peoples and cultures in particular public architecture agricultural technology specular geology and striking diversity the images offer a narrative of the multiplicity of peoples as demonstrated in their clothing economic and everyday activities their physical surroundings consequently the narrative combines global economics national politics and daily social life throughout the region the chapters can be read as individual histories for each of the countries within the context created by contrasts and similarities with the other nations of latin america

this book presents in depth analyses of the data gathered for 26 years by the political elites of latin america project pela the

most comprehensive database about the topic in the world since 1994. Pela has conducted around 9 000 personal interviews with representative samples of the legislative powers of 18 Latin American countries generating a unique resource for the study of political elites in a comparative perspective. Now this contributed volume brings together studies that dig into the data gathered by Pela to discuss important topics related to the challenges faced by representative democracy in Latin America. After an introductory chapter that presents the potential of the Pela database, the book is structured in two parts. The first addresses in eight chapters important aspects of representative democracy such as political ambition, political trust, satisfaction with democracy, clientelism, and the quality of democracy. It then discusses three relevant issues in Latin American political dynamics such as executive-legislative relations, women's participation as representatives, and the meaning of China and the United States in national politics. The second part addresses in five chapters studies of seven national cases that are representative of regional heterogeneity. These chapters aim to examine parliamentarian elites' attitudes in different political systems with regard to a variety of relevant issues such as institutional trust, satisfaction with democracy, executive-legislative relations, clientelism, and gender questions. Furthermore, these chapters intend to evince the evolution of such attitudes in the course of the last two decades. Politics and political elites in Latin America: challenges and trends will be of interest to scholars and students of comparative politics in general and more particularly to those interested in the challenges faced by representative democracy not only in Latin America but in many parts of the world.

Latin America is a region made up of multiple states with a diversity of races, ethnicities, and cultures. In transnational perspectives on Latin America, Luis Roniger argues that a regional perspective is significant for understanding this part of the Western Hemisphere. He claims that geopolitical, sociological, and cultural trends molded a contiguity of influences shaping a transnational arena of connected histories, cross-border interactions, and shared visions complementing the process of separate nation-state formation.

Noted theologian Samuel Escobar offers a magisterial survey and study of Christology in Latin America. In search of Christ in Latin America examines the figure of Jesus Christ in the context of Latin American culture, starting with the first Spanish influence in the sixteenth century and moving through popular religiosity and liberationist themes in Catholic and Protestant thought of the twentieth and twenty-first centuries, culminating in an important description of the work of the *fraternidad teológica latinoamericana*. F. T. L. Escobar provides theological, historical, and cultural analysis of Latin American understandings of Christ and places liberation theology within its social and revolutionary context. This book is an important step toward a rich understanding of the spiritual reality and powerful message of Jesus.

Cybersecurity Governance in Latin America discusses how the massification of the Internet has exposed emerging democracies to high-tech vulnerabilities to cyber attacks and questions why states have decided to introduce policies and legislation facilitating the militarization of cyberspace. Carlos Solar offers a comparative analysis using the cases of Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Mexico, and Venezuela to help navigate the changing security landscape and the growing risks found in the digital domain. His analysis includes a review of civilian and military

preparedness emphasizing the ongoing alliances with the world's superpowers to finally debate what are the side effects for peace and development in the Americas from the current cybersecurity rivalry between the United States and China providing a much needed account of state technology affairs in the Global South cybersecurity governance in Latin America challenges scholars and policymakers to rethink the protection of cyberspace to avoid unnecessarily sacrificing rights and freedoms in the name of national security

until the late 1980s Japan was the only country in Asia with notable political and economic relations since then however several Asian nations have perceived growing links with the Latin American region as a means of diversifying their political and particularly economic relations while many Latin American decision makers have increasingly recognised the strategic importance of East Asia in their foreign policy and foreign economic policy designs this book analyses the economic political and socio cultural relations between Asia and Latin America and examines their growing importance in international relations in the first part of the book the contributors look at the policies interests and strategies of individual Asian and Latin American states while the second part delves into the analysis of multilateral institution building in Asia Latin America relations as such Asia and Latin America will be of interest to undergraduate and postgraduate scholars of comparative politics international relations Asian politics and Latin American politics

multicultural citizenship it will also help policy makers and activists by discussing the successes and failures of effective indigenous political representation in latin america

the resurgence of the left in latin america over the past decade has been so notable that it has been called the pink tide in recent years regimes with leftist leaders have risen to power in argentina bolivia brazil chile ecuador el salvador nicaragua uruguay and venezuela what does this trend portend for the deepening of democracy in the region benjamin goldfrank has been studying the development of participatory democracy in latin america for many years and this book represents the culmination of his empirical investigations in brazil uruguay and venezuela in order to understand why participatory democracy has succeeded better in some countries than in others he examines the efforts in urban areas that have been undertaken in the cities of porto alegre montevideo and caracas his findings suggest that success is related most crucially to how nationally centralized political authority is and how strongly institutionalized the opposition parties are in the local arenas

this work studies the development of bilateral relations in two pairs of states dyads argentina brazil and argentina chile it takes on a moderate constructivist approach that incorporates into the analysis of international relations the role of identities ideas and perceptions as well as of material forces and understands that the former are affected and changed during interaction it also uses to securitization theory to explain how issues come or cease to be considered security matters through social constructions

this volume analyses south american regional and international cooperation during the covid19 crisis started in 2020 across thirteen chapters a collection of leading experts address how regional collaboration has developed evolved and recoiled the chapters explore the state of regionalism at the pandemic surge and the challenges and opportunities this situation has opened for regional and international cooperation authors analyze the role of extra regional powers and traditional regional leaders during the pandemic identifying the extent to which regional cooperation has been possible across several policy agendas they argue that fragmented visions of regionalism ideological polarization and weak leadership has prevailed from before the pandemic which accompanied by adverse interactions among major powers has ensured that cooperation has remained bilateral rather than regional ultimately all these factors have created a complex scenario in which disintegration dynamics have emerged darkening even more the south american regional panorama regional and international cooperation in south america after covid will be an invaluable resource for students scholars and policy specialists of regionalism and regional integration latin american studies
