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first published in 1925 this renowned reference remains unsurpassed as a source of essential information from construction and evolution to repertoire and technique includes a glossary and 73 illustrations

this is the first and only scholarly book to date on george rochberg b 1918 the pre eminent post wwii american composer and essayist it was compiled with his assistance and gathers into one volume previously scattered and hard to find material by and about the composer included are traditional types of scholarly information on rochberg e g his works date of composition publisher timing commission premiere instrumentation program notes by the composer etc discography biography a chronological listing of his compositions and the major events of his life autograph manuscripts documents housed in public collections libraries texts used in the works with voice and bibliography books articles and reviews by and about rochberg this is an essential guide for any performer scholar critic or student of george rochberg s music

arguably the most important american composer of the century elliot carter often has been more highly regarded in europe than in his native land interest in his work has grown rapidly in recent years however and the celebration of his ninetieth birthday in december 1998 accompanied by numerous performances and new recordings undoubtedly will increase the attention of his fellow citizens to this remarkable figure authoritative and

gracefully written the music of Elliott Carter engages composers performers and critics and speaks to concertgoers whether attuned to or alarmed by the formidable difficulty of Carter's music David Schiff views the music from the perspective of the composer's development and relates his compositional techniques to those nonmusical arts contemporary American poetry in particular with which Carter has been deeply involved the volume benefits from Schiff's extensive discussions of Carter's works with their most noted performers including Heinz Holliger Oliver Knussen and Ursula Oppens and from the generous cooperation of the composer himself this new edition a thoroughly reorganized revised and updated version of the book published in 1983 accounts for the many new works written by Carter since 1980 and accommodates the burgeoning critical literature on his music its features include many musical examples and a selected discography in addition to the new foreword the composer has provided his listing of three to six note chords and a note on voyage

revised edition Adolf Busch 1891-1952 was an all round musician and a moral beacon in troubled times as first violin of the Busch String Quartet founded in 1912 he was the greatest quartet player of the last century and he led a famous conductorless orchestra the Busch Chamber Players he was also the busiest solo violinist of the inter war years regularly performing major concertos with such conductors as Nikisch Toscanini Weingartner Walter Furtwängler Boult Wood Barbirolli and his elder brother Fritz he was moreover an outstanding composer whose works enjoyed performances in Germany and further afield frequently he appeared as soloist and composer in the same concert his courageous decision to boycott his native country from April 1933 despite Hitler's efforts to persuade our German violinist to return drastically reduced his income and damaged his career as soloist and composer in 1938 because of Mussolini's race laws he imposed a similar boycott on Italy where he was wildly popular the following year he emigrated with his quartet colleagues to the United States where he was not fully appreciated although he had many successes with a new chamber orchestra and founded the Marlboro Summer School this biography based on more than thirty years research examines Busch's exemplary behaviour in the context of a tumultuous era volume one traces his progress from childhood in Westphalia through friendships with Fritz Steinbach Donald Tovey and Max Reger early triumphs in Berlin London and Vienna years of maturity and fulfilment rejection of Hitler's Germany and close bonds with

british musicians and concert goers in the 1930s it ends just before his move into american exile volume two follows busch through the second world war his return to give concerts in europe in the late 1940s and his founding of the marlboro summer school in vermont shortly before his untimely death a series of appendices consider busch as violinist violist and teacher his taste and repertoire his interpretations his colleagues his celebrated recordings and his compositions

more folk strings is a collection of melodies from around the world in a variety of moods and with rhythmic patterns and harmonies that are representative of their country of origin because of the flexible scoring used in more folk strings players at a variety of levels can make music together and less experienced players can play the solo melody parts which use little or no shifting and are in accessible keys some pieces in the collection are easier than others the collection is available in a number of instrumentations for string quartet or string orchestra for violin ensemble viola ensemble cello ensemble for two three or four violin viola or cello players in any combination of these instruments and for solo violin solo viola and solo cello the piano accompaniment may be used with any of the combinations in more folk strings for string quartet or string orchestra the melody is passed around so that all members of the ensemble can have the opportunity to play the tune score and parts are marked with melody and harmony to help players bring out the melody at the appropriate moment teachers notes provide lyrics and background information on each folk song in addition to rehearsal and performance suggestions

folk strings is a collection of folk melodies from around the world arranged for strings unlike classical music which normally has an authentic version folk music often exists in many versions with differences in the melody or lyrics sometimes several countries lay claim to a melody because a group of people moved to a new country and took their music with them most folk songs were sung and played for many years before they were written down and their original composer is usually unknown this collection includes melodies in a variety of moods and with rhythmic patterns which are representative of their country of origin the arrangements in folk strings can be effective with players at a variety of levels in order to provide maximum flexibility the collection is available in a number of instrumentations

unaccompanied choral works composed or otherwise arranged by brahms for mixed choruses as well as individual men s and women s choruses include songs love songs romances quartetes and duets

music is surrounded by movement from the arching back of the guitarist to the violinist swaying with each bow stroke to john paul ito these actions are not just a visual display rather they reveal what it really means for musicians to move with the beat organizing the flow of notes from beat to beat and shaping the sound produced by developing focal impulse theory ito shows how a performer s choices of how to move with the meter can transform the music s expressive contours change the dance of the performer s body and you change the dance of the notes as focal impulse theory deftly illustrates bodily movements carry musical meaning and in a very real sense are meaning
